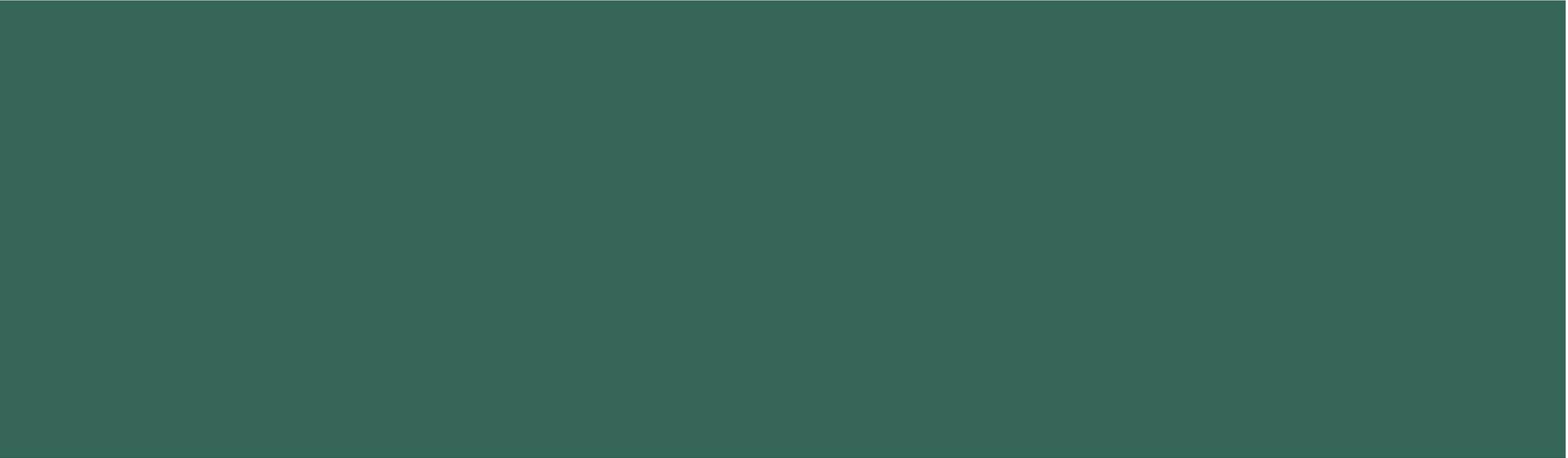




SALADO MAIN STREET, PARKS AND GREEN SPACE

DESIGN PROGRAM

- **Connectivity** – Create a streetscape that is well connected and accessible.
- **Aesthetics** – Develop a consistent aesthetic that is easy to maintain, respects the history of Salado, and also incorporates the local art and uniqueness of the Village.
- **Usability** – Designs should improve the usability of previously unused or underused spaces and allow for easy access by Salado residents as well as visitors.



SALADO MAIN STREET CONCEPTS

For the streetscape, We propose keeping an open curb-less design that leaves the side of the road open to pedestrians and allows for easy access of the shops along main street. Dedicated crossing areas would make navigating main street safer for pedestrians and swales along the side of the road would improve aesthetics and help to manage storm water runoff.




PARK AND PARKING LOCATIONS

Green: Proposed Park Locations


Yellow: Proposed Lots

PARK CONCEPTS: ENTRANCE LOCATION

Currently used as a storage area for construction base material, this space lies at the intersection of Main Street and the I-35 service road to the south.

This space can transition nicely into a combination rest stop and gateway into the Village of Salado. Naturalistic plantings would be visible from the highway, and much of what is now weeds and road base would be replaced with wildflowers and native grasses.

Peddler's Alley which runs behind a row of shops that face main street, is a collection of dirt and gravel roads that border the Glassworks and Lucye's Restaurant.




PARK CONCEPTS: PEDDLER'S ALLEY

This green space behind the civic center, while useable as a place to set up tents and displays during festivals, has little use for the people of Salado outside of these times.




PARK CONCEPTS: CIVIC CENTER


