Minutes of Regular Meeting of Board of Aldermen October 19, 2023, at 6:30 p.m.

The Board of Aldermen meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Mayor Michael Coggin. The meeting was conducted in person and using videoconferencing. Public participation was available via videoconference.

Mayor Coggin gave the Invocation, and the Board of Aldermen led the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and Texas flags.

Board Members Present: Mayor Michael Coggin, Alderman Paul Cox, Alderman D. Jasen Graham, Alderman Bert Henry, and Alderman Jason Howard (via videoconference).

Board Members Absent: Mayor Pro-tem Rodney Bell.

Staff Present: Village Administrator Don Ferguson, Assistant Administrator Andrea Howard, Police Chief Alan Fields, and City Secretary Debbie Bean.

1. Citizens Communications

Bill Grace, owner of Mustang Springs Ranch, spoke regarding his concern with the location of the Mustang Springs development wastewater treatment plant, unpermitted construction, and the impact of the development on his property value. He stated his property has been in the ETJ of the Village of Salado for about 20 years.

Salado area residents Jesssica Greenfield and Brandy Sandor told board members they have raised funds for Main Street Christmas decorations and would like permission to proceed with acquisition and installation of the decorations.

Salado area resident Jim Boynton congratulated Alderman Howard on a recent award he received for his military and public service. Boynton also expressed concerns regarding flooding, dumping and road widths at the Water's Edge apartment/townhome development.

Salado resident Jack Comeaux expressed concern regarding the quality of workmanship on the Water's Edge apartment development. apartment complex. He also stated he is opposed to scooters being allowed on the streets of the Village due to traffic safety concerns.

2. Consent Agenda

Alderman Paul Cox made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, as presented. Alderman Bert Henry seconded. Motion was approved with a 4-0 vote.

3. Status Reports

- (A) Village Administrator's Report
 - All-Abilities Playground

Village Administrator Don Ferguson reported that the overhead power and communication lines over the proposed playground site, along with an abandoned utility pole, have both been removed. He said construction is expected to begin next week.

Sales Tax Collection

Village Administrator Ferguson said the October 2023 check, representing August sales in Salado, was \$64,575.00 - up 6.7% from the same period last year. He added the check was the largest October sales tax check in the Village's history.

• Bell County Hazard Mitigation Plan

Village Administrator Ferguson reported the Bell County hazard Mitigation Plan is being updated. He said the goal of the plan is to minimize long-term risks to human life and property from future disasters.

Drought Update

Village Administrator Ferguson said Bell County remains in a drought with 59% of the county experiencing "exceptional drought" conditions and 41% seeing "extreme drought" conditions.

Village Administrator Ferguson also reported on the status of the new municipal building project and the stepped-up building inspections at the Water's Edge apartment development.

Mayor Coggin cautioned board members to not go onto the apartment complex property. He said the property is private property and only authorized personnel from the Village are allowed on the site. He urged members to contact the Village Administrator if they have any questions.

4. Resolution

Consider Approval of a Resolution of the Board of Alderman of the Village of Salado, Texas, Authorizing Hiring of Bond Counsel on a Contingency Fee Basis to Handle Bond Matters Relating to the Sanctuary Public Improvement Districts.

Village Administrator Ferguson explained that the Village must have bond counsel to assist the Village with the issuance of the bonds for the Sanctuary Public Improvement Districts. He noted the bond counsel is funded through bond proceeds and not city tax dollars.

Ferguson said staff is recommending board members engage the Village's general legal counsel, *Bickerstaff Heath Delgado Acosta LLP* (the "Bickerstaff"), to serve as the Village's bond counsel.

Attorney Gregory Miller with Bickerstaff answered questions from board members about the role of the bond counsel.

Alderman D. Jasen Graham made a motion to approve the resolution authorizing hiring of bond counsel on a contingency fee basis to handle bond matters relating to the Sanctuary Public Improvement Districts. Alderman Cox seconded. Motion carried with a 4-0 vote.

5. Discussion and Possible Action

(A) Discuss and Consider Possible Action Regarding a Proposal to Install Christmas Decorations on the Street Light Poles on Main Street within the Corporate Limits of the Village of Salado.

Village Administrator Ferguson reported a citizens' group called the "Elves" who have raised funds to pay for the acquisition and installation of Christmas decorations on the Main Street light poles and the historic "Green Bridge".

Board members discussed the types of decorations that would be appropriate and affordable.

Alderman Howard pointed out that, at this time, the Board was only granting permission to proceed and not deciding on specific decorations. He said the decision on the decorations to be installed would be the volunteers leading the holiday decoration effort.

Alderman Henry made a motion to authorize the "Elves" to install Christmas decorations on Main Street. Aldermen Cox seconded. Motion was approved with 4-0 vote.

(A) Discuss and Consider Possible Action Regarding a Proposal to Rent Scooters for use on Public Streets within the Corporate Limits of the Village of Salado.

Mayor Coggin announced this item has been moved to the November 2nd meeting at the request of the presenter.

(B) Discuss and Consider Possible Action Regarding the Village of Salado Employee Health and Life Plans for the Fiscal Year 2024.

Village Administrator Ferguson said staff is recommending the Board contract with BlueCross BlueShield to provide employee insurance benefits and a contract with Guardian to provide employee dental, vision, and life insurance.

He said the monthly premium for employee medical insurance from BlueCross BlueShield will increase from \$807.38 to \$810.51 per employee. He added the monthly premium for vision coverage from Guardian will increase from \$6.16 to \$7.54 per employee while the monthly premium for dental coverage will decrease from \$28.44 to \$25.66 per employee.

Ferguson also asked board members to authorize the Village Administrator to negotiate new rates for employee life insurance coverage, noting any increase will be nominal.

Alderman Cox made a motion to approve the recommendations from staff regarding employee medical, dental, vision and life insurance for the coming fiscal year. Alderman Henry seconded. Motion was approved with a 4-0 vote.

(C) Discuss and Consider Possible Action Regarding a Proposed Non-Prosecution Agreement with Kerby Ventures LLC Relating to Unpermitted Construction.

Village Administrator Ferguson reported that in late September 2023, the Village staff discovered that unpermitted construction had been done at the site of the Mustang Springs development off FM 2843. He said upon the discovery of the unpermitted construction, a Stop Work Order was immediately issued by the Village along with a Notice of Violation of the Village's Subdivision Ordinance.

Ferguson said representatives of Kerby Ventures LLC, the Mustang Springs developer, met with Village staff and agreed to pay a \$45,000 fine in lieu of the Village pursuing criminal and civil charges relating to the unpermitted construction. He said the fine amount

is equal to the total amount criminal and civil fines that could be levied for thirty (30) days of unpermitted construction.

In addition to the fine, Ferguson said the developer has agreed to comply with all Village ordinances and to not do any construction in the future without the required permits.

Ferguson said the proposed non-prosecution agreement keeps the Village from having to expend substantial legal fees pursuing criminal and civil cases against the developer.

In response to a question from Mayor Coggin, Administrator Ferguson said non-prosecution agreement only applies to the thirty (30) days identified in the agreement. He said agreement does not prevent the Village from taking the developer to court in the event of future code violations.

Alderman Henry said he felt like taking the developer to court was a better option in gaining compliance.

Alderman Cox moved to approve the non-prosecution agreement the \$45,000 penalty agreement due the following Monday. Alderman Graham suggested amending the motion with payment being due within five (5) business days. Alderman Cox accepted the amendment to the motion. The amended motion was seconded by Alderman Graham. Motion carried with a 3-2 vote with Mayor Coggin, Alderman Cox and Graham voting in favor and Alderman Henry and Jason Howard voting no.

(D) Discuss and Consider Possible Action Regarding the Lum Addition Final Replat Located near the Intersection of FM 2268 and Oak Park Lane within the Corporate Limits of the Village of Salado.

Village Administrator Ferguson said the applicants, Betty and Larry Lum, are proposing to add a 0.099-acre tract of land to an adjacent 0.2324-acre tract of land in the Oxford Drive Phase I Subdivision. He noted both tracts are owned by the applicant.

Ferguson said the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the plat that was found to be code compliance by the Village Engineer.

Alderman Cox made a motion to approve the final plat, as presented. Alderman Graham seconded. Motion was approved on a 4-0 vote.

(E) Discussion and Consider Possible Action Regarding the Proposed Final Plat and Associated Waivers for the Walker Greensward Subdivision Located on Staghorn Road in the ETJ of the Village of Salado.

Village Administrator Ferguson said the applicant is proposing to consolidate four (4) lots they own into one (1) lot. He said the resulting lot has frontage on Staghorn Road and Brigadoon Road, noting double frontage lots are prohibited by the Subdivision Code.

Ferguson said the Village Engineer reviewed the proposed amending plat and found it to be in compliance with the Village's Subdivision Regulations with the exception of the provision prohibiting double frontage lots. He said the applicant has requested a variance from the subdivision regulation relating to double frontage lots and is agreeable to prohibiting any future driveway access to the property off Brigadoon Road.

Alderman Graham made a motion to approve the proposed plat with the requested variance. Alderman Cox seconded. Motion was approved with a 4-0.

(F) Discuss and Consider Issues Regarding the Search for a New Village Administrator.

Alderman Graham gave an update including the recruitment, noting twenty (21) applicants have been received. He outlined the upcoming interview and site visit plans for the finalists.

With there being no further business, Mayor Coggin called the meeting adjourned at 8:04 p.m.

Project/Proposal Summary:

This item was placed on the agenda to allow board members to discuss and consider action regarding disclosure requirements regarding the sale of property located in the Sanctuary Public Improvement Districts (the "PID").

Currently, State law requires every seller of property subject to or part of a PID to disclose to a buyer the existence of and certain details about the particular PID prior to the execution of a binding contract, otherwise the buyer has the right to terminate the contract.

In addition, the statute requires that another copy of the prescribed PID notice, with current information, be executed by the seller and buyer at the property closing.

The Village staff is proposing to enhance the statutory disclosure obligations by requiring signage at the entrance to a PID development providing notice to prospective buyers of the existence of and certain details about the PID. Additionally, staff is proposing to require a similar notice on all printed and digital materials used to market properties located within a PID. The signage and wording of the notice would require Village approval in advance.

If board members desire to move forward with the additional disclosure requirements, a proposed ordinance establishing the notice requirements will be drafted and presented for board approval at the next Board meeting.

Project/Proposal Summary:

This item was placed on the agenda to allow board members to discuss and consider action approving a contractor for the Stagecoach Circle Drainage Improvement Project.

Earlier this month, the Village sought bids for the Stagecoach Circle Drainage Improvement Project. The proposed improvements involve the replacement of several driveway drainage culverts on Chisholm Trail and the installation of a subsurface drainage pipe on Stagecoach Circle.

Nine (9) contractors submitted bids. Below is a breakdown of the bids.

The Village Engineer's estimated price tag for the project was \$535,248.

After reviewing the bids and checking references, the Village Engineer recommends the Board enter into a contract with Royal Vista, Inc. to complete the Stagecoach Circle Drainage Improvement Project at a cost of \$499,986.50.

The project will be funded with \$322,190.20 remaining in American Relief Act Funding, along with \$177,796.30 from the General Fund Balance. The motion to contract with the recommended contractor will need to also reflect a budget amendment for the use of fund balance.

We have reviewed the bids for the above referenced project and Royal Vista, Inc. is the lowest qualified bidder with a base bid amount of \$499,986.50. Project/Proposal Summary:

This item was placed on the agenda to allow board members to discuss and consider possible action regarding a proposal to rent electric scooters for use on Village streets.

Salado residents Melanie Ringstaff and Lee Pointer are seeking permission to rent electric scooters for use on Village streets. Attached is a copy of their proposal.

Currently, the Village does not have a vehicle-for-hire ordinance to regulate such use of the public right of way.

Ms. Ringstaff and Mr. Pointer will be present at the meeting to present their proposal and answer questions.

Salado Electric Scooter Rentals Business Proposal

Executive Summary:

My name is Marshal Lee Pointer, and I am a resident of the Village of Salado. After observing the increasing popularity of bicycles and electric scooters in our community, I propose the establishment of an electric scooter rental business in Salado. This business will offer an enjoyable and eco-friendly activity for both residents and visitors, ultimately benefiting our village through increased commerce and reduced carbon footprint.

Market Research:

Electric scooter rentals have gained popularity in cities across the country, including nearby Austin and Abilene, Texas. In Texas, electric scooters are regulated under existing DMV rules for "motor-assisted scooters." Given the lack of specific state-level regulations, many cities and colleges in Texas have already adopted scooter sharing programs, making electric scooters a familiar mode of transportation to many Texans.

Benefits for the City:

Electric scooters provide a safe and eco-friendly transportation option, reducing the carbon footprint of both residents and visitors. This aligns with the village's commitment to sustainability and environmental responsibility.

Infrastructure and Safety:

To ensure the safety of riders and pedestrians, our business will encourage helmet usage, adherence to traffic laws, and avoiding riding on sidewalks. Geofencing GPS perimeters will be established to restrict scooter use on roads with speed limits exceeding 35 mph. Additionally, riders must be 16 or older and agree to a waiver with safe riding instructions before renting.

Rental bases will be established in collaboration with local merchants or landowners, utilizing GPS coordinates to designate scooter rental and drop-off locations. This approach ensures that scooters are kept in designated areas, minimizing clutter and safety concerns.

Accessibility and Inclusivity:

Our scooter rental service will be available to all residents and visitors over the age of 16. To promote safety, scooters will be equipped with geofencing technology to limit their maximum speed to 10 mph through the pilot phase and adjusted accordingly thereafter.

Our business will create job opportunities related to scooter maintenance, charging, advertising/marketing, and rental adoption. The presence of scooter rental stations may also increase foot traffic on Main Street, benefiting local businesses.

Data Sharing and Privacy:

We will provide rental data to city officials for planning purposes. All personally identifiable information (PII), including payment data, will be securely encrypted and handled with utmost privacy.

Public Engagement:

We will promote our service through local media such as the Village Voice, Social Media, Google, and physical signage. We encourage user ratings and feedback via our mobile application, Social Media and on Google.

Licenses / Permits:

I respectfully request a business permit to launch my electric scooter rental business.

Fleet Management and Maintenance:

Our fleet will be monitored through a vehicle fleet dashboard, ensuring that scooters are in optimal condition. Scooters will be regularly picked up, charged, and maintained. Customers who do not return scooters to designated locations will be subject to a surcharge.

Risk Mitigation:

Our LLC will purchase liability insurance, and our vendor partner also carries a \$1M policy. In adverse weather conditions or unsafe circumstances, scooters will be temporarily removed from operation.

Project/Proposal Summary:

This item was placed on the agenda by Mayor Michael Coggin to allow board members to discuss and consider action initiating the process to assess roadway impact fees on new development to help fund road improvements in the Village.

The Village currently negotiates site-specific improvements with developers, such as adding deceleration lanes, or contributions to intersection improvements including traffic signals, based on a case-by-case traffic impact analysis. But not all developments require this analysis as part of the planning and development process.

Roadway impact fees are one-time costs assessed to developers within the corporate limits of the Village in order to improve roadway capacity. The funds can be used to help accommodate growth and serve the overall transportation system as allowed by state law.

To establish roadway impact fees, the Village must take the following steps:

- Board of Aldermen shall hire a transportation consultant to evaluate, develop and create an implementation plan for roadway impact fees. That consultant will also identify an impact fee per unit of new development necessary to fund roadway improvements in accordance with state law.
- Consultant shall hold multiple stakeholder meetings.
- A Capital Improvements Advisory Committee, appointed by the Board of Aldermen, shall review consultant-developed information, and make a recommendation to the Board regarding the implementation of roadway impact fees.
- Board of Aldermen shall hold at least two (2) public hearings prior to acting on proposed roadway impact fees

Roughly one quarter of cities in Texas, mostly in high-growth areas, have roadway impact fees.

Funding for the proposed grants will come from Hotel Occupancy Tax proceeds budgeted for the arts in Salado.

Staff recommends approval of the grant funding for these events.

Salado Cultural Arts District Grant Program

Describe the advertising efforts.: We send newspaper articles to all newspapers in a 75 mile radius, entertainers post their schedules and promote the event on their social media, utilize Temple newspaper which has online and weekly ads plus two articles in exchange for using their ticket services, Facebook, ad in international Western Music Association's magazine, and flyers sent to other Texas gatherings/reciprocity. A West Texas radio station promotes the event with free ads and church members help by distributing posters throughout the area. The Village Voice has been an outstanding supporter and provided our event schedule in the Jewel magazine. We hope to work with the Salado Museum, library and our Village music friendly association. Word of mouth is the most effective publicity. By giving free mini concerts this year, I hope to get more involvement/awareness from local businesses for 2024.
