BOA & Mr. De La Rosa,

I am Lynette Jones, Executive Director of Salado Museum and College Park. Since 1961, we have sponsored the Salado Scottish Gathering and Highland Games. The Gathering is the primary fund-raiser for the non-profit museum. We operate fully on donations, grants, and this fund-raiser. The building and college ruins property were donated to the non-profit several years ago by the Robertson family. The Robertson family settled in Salado in the early 1850's, and still own the family property south of Salado.

This year will be my second year as the museum director during the Gathering and first as co-chairman. In the past, food truck vendors have not been asked for permits to serve food. Part of our income from the Gathering is from charging vendor space fees, and adding the permit fees may be cost prohibitive to some of our previous vendors. As someone who was in the restaurant business for almost 13 years, I recognize the importance of why it is necessary to enforce those health department permits. Most of our vendors travel from outside Bell County and some outside of the state, so they would hold health certificates from their home base. We would like to request the Village waive the fees of the permit for this two-day event but require the permit certificate for the vendor's local health district and present their certificates to the Village office.

This event brings 3000 plus people to the Village each November as it has for 63 years. And while we do have vendors at the event, many of the participants and spectators come because they love to shop, eat, and visit Salado. I know this because I hear this over and over from them. The number one complaint we hear from them is, "Why can't we have this back at the Civic Center?", as the shops and restaurants are easier to access from the Civic Center. While we would also like to have it back at the Civic Center, the space is simply not large enough to accommodate. The event will be held again this year at SISD's Thomas Arnold Elementary School.

I would also like to invite and encourage the board and Village citizens to attend this very special event.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOSITION OF A LIEN ON AN OWNER'S PROPERTY, OTHER THAN HOMESTEAD OR RENTAL PROPERTY, AFTER NOTICE FOR DELINQUENT BILLS FOR UTILITY SERVICE TO THE PROPERTY: FINDINGS OF FACT; EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code § 51.032, the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village of Salado, Texas (the "Village") is authorized by law to adopt an ordinance, not inconsistent with state law, that it considers proper for the government of the Village and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Village; and

WHEREAS, Section 552.0025 of the Texas Local Government Code gives municipalities the authority by ordinance to impose a lien on certain property for delinquent bills for municipal utility service to certain property; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Village to have the ability to impose a lien on eligible properties as a means of securing payment for delinquent bills for utility services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

SECTION I. ENACTMENT PROVISIONS

- A. Findings of Fact: All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village of Salado and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this ordinance as if copied in their entirety.
- **B. Popular Name:** This Ordinance shall be commonly referred to as "The Lien for Delinquent Utility Services Bills Ordinance."
- **C. Scope:** This Ordinance, and the rules and regulations adopted herein, shall apply generally within the Village limits.
- **D.** Effective Date: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication.

SECTION II. ADOPTION

Ordinance No. 2024-05 is hereby adopted as follows:

- 1. When delinquent charges imposed by this article for any utility services provided by the Village remain unpaid, the Village Administrator may impose or authorize the imposition of a lien against the real property to which service is being provided, or intended to be provided. The lien shall include and secure any delinquent charges, penalties, interest, and collection costs. The Village Administrator shall perfect or authorize the perfection of the lien by filing a "Notice of Lien" containing a legal description of the property and the utility account number for the delinquent charges in the real property records of the county in which the property is located.
- 2. The lien authorized in this section shall not apply to bills for service connected in a tenant's name after notice by the property owner to the municipality that the property is rental property.
- 3. The lien authorized by this Ordinance shall not apply to homestead property protected by the Texas Constitution.
- 4. The lien authorized in this Ordinance is superior to all liens except for a bona fide mortgage lien that is recorded before the recording of the Village's utility lien in the real property records of the county where the property is located.

SECTION III. SAVINGS CLAUSE

The repeal of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue, or as affecting any rights of the Village under any section or provisions of any ordinances at the time of passage of this ordinance.

SECTION IV. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any provision, section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of the same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado in adopting, and of the Mayor in approving this Ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall be come inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any portion, provision or regulation.

SECTION V. REPEALER CLAUSE

The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances or parts of ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein, provided, however, that all prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent that such inconsistency is

apparent. This Ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other Ordinance.

SECTION VI. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as may be required by governing law.

SECTION VII. NOTICE AND MEETING CLAUSE

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS TO AND CONCERNING CAMPING, AND PROVIDING FINDINGS OF FACT; EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code § 51.032, the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village of Salado, Texas (the "Village") is authorized by law to adopt an ordinance, not inconsistent with state law, that it considers proper for the government of the Village and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village seeks to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, unauthorized camping is frequently the cause of public health nuisances, including the improper disposal of human excreta, wastewater, and garbage, as defined by Section 34.011 of the Texas Health and Safety Code; and

WHEREAS, unauthorized camping may provide harborage to rodents and other diseasecarrying pests which may be innately harmful to people and property; and

WHEREAS, unauthorized camping creates a fire hazard to structures, parks, and nearby properties; and

WHEREAS, unauthorized camping may diminish property values and the appearance of a neighborhood, diminishing any incentive for others in the neighborhood to maintain their own property, thus creating a self-perpetuating cycle; and

WHEREAS, unauthorized camping is prohibited under state law as described in Texas Penal Code section 48.05; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Village to have the ability to regulate unauthorized camping within the Village; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

SECTION I. ENACTMENT PROVISIONS

- A. Findings of Fact: All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village of Salado and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this ordinance as if copied in their entirety.
- **B. Popular Name:** This Ordinance shall be commonly referred to as "The Unauthorized Camping Ordinance."
- C. Scope: This Ordinance, and the rules and regulations adopted herein, shall apply generally within the Village limits.
- **D. Effective Date:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication.

SECTION II. ADOPTION

Ordinance No. 2024-__ is hereby adopted as follows:

1. <u>Terms defined</u>. In this section these terms have the following definitions:

AUTHORIZATION. Express written permission given by the property owner or the owner's agent.

CAMP. To reside or dwell temporarily in a place, using Transitory Shelter.

GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. A political subdivision of the state, including, but not limited to, a municipality, county, unit of state government, public school district, junior college district or special purpose district.

NON-RESIDENTIAL. Any property or area within the territorial limits of the Village that is not included in a Residential District as defined in the Zoning Ordinance or that is used as a commercial, municipal, park, or industrial use.

PRIVATE PROPERTY. Property or an area that is owned by a non-governmental entity or individual.

RESIDENTIAL. Any property or area within the territorial limits of the Village that is located in a Residential District as defined in the Zoning Ordinance, including vacant residentially-zoned lots.

RESIDE OR DWELL. Without limitation, eating, sleeping, or the storage of personal possessions.

TRANSITORY SHELTER. Without limitation, any tent, tarpaulin, lean-to, sleeping bag, bedroll, blankets, or any form of cover or protection from the elements other than clothing.

- 2. <u>Prohibition</u>. It shall be unlawful for any person to camp upon any:
- (1) residential or non-residential private property without possessing authorization of the property owner or the owner's agent; or
- (c) *Defenses*. It is an affirmative defense to prosecution that a person charged with violation of this section owns the property or has permission to camp upon it.
- (d) *Penalty*. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.
- (e) Any property on which camping occurs shall be subject to all other ordinances of the Village of Salado, including those related to zoning and health and safety.

SECTION III. SAVINGS CLAUSE

The repeal of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue, or as affecting any rights of the Village under any section or provisions of any ordinances at the time of passage of this ordinance.

SECTION IV. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any provision, section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of the same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado in adopting, and of the Mayor in approving this Ordinance, that no portion thereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall be come inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any portion, provision or regulation.

SECTION V. REPEALER CLAUSE

The provisions of this ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances or parts of ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein, provided, however, that all prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent that such inconsistency is apparent. This Ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act which is prohibited by any other Ordinance.

SECTION VI. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as may be required by governing law.

SECTION VII. NOTICE AND MEETING CLAUSE

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-08

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2017.07, ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS; REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2017.07, AND PROVIDING FINDINGS OF FACT; EFFECTIVE DATE; REPEALER; SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code § 51.032, the Board of Aldermen (the "Board") of the Village of Salado, Texas (the "Village") is authorized by law to adopt an ordinance, not inconsistent with state law, that it considers proper for the government of the Village and is necessary or proper for carrying out a power granted by law to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Board has adopted an ordinance allowing the sale of beer, wine, and mixed beverages, and establishing a permitting system for same that property regulates establishments that serve alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, the Board now finds it necessary to amend this ordinance to revise and improve the permitting process for establishments that serve alcoholic beverages;

WHEREAS, the regulations adopted in this Ordinance are in furtherance of the public interest, and for the good government, peace, order, trade, and commerce of the Village and necessary and proper for carrying out the power granted by law to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village seeks to provide for the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

SECTION I. ENACTMENT PROVISIONS

- A. Findings of Fact: All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Village of Salado and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this ordinance as if copied in their entirety.
- **B. Popular Name:** This Ordinance shall be commonly referred to as "The Amendment to the Alcoholic Beverage Ordinance."
- **C. Scope:** This Ordinance, and the rules and regulations adopted herein, shall apply generally within the Village limits.

D. Effective Date: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication.

SECTION II. ADOPTION

Ordinance No. 2024-__, amending Ordinance 2017.07, is hereby adopted as follows:

"SECTION 2. PERMITS

2.1 Permit or License Required

It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, distill, brew, sell, or possess for the purpose of sale any beer, wine, or other alcoholic beverage, or otherwise engage in any activity for which a license or permit is required by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code as amended, unless the person has a current and unrevoked permit issued by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

- (a) The sale, storage, or handling of alcoholic beverages for the purpose of sale is permitted only where the use is authorized by and complies with all applicable provisions of this Code and the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code. A permit or license issued by the Village for the sale, storage, or handling of alcoholic beverages is valid for two (2) years and runs concurrently with any permit or license issued by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission ("TABC"). Any business with a valid alcoholic beverage permit or license issued by TABC at the time this ordinance is adopted shall not require a permit or license from the Village until the time that its TABC permit or license requires renewal.
- (b) Applicability. This section applies to:
 - (1) An original application or a renewal application for a permit or license required by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code; and
 - (2) A permittee seeking to change the place of business for which a permit or license is issued, if the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code requires the city secretary to certify that the sale of alcoholic beverages at a place of business is authorized by city ordinance.
- (c) Filing of application. The applicant for a permit or license subject to this section shall file a completed and verified application with the city secretary on the form promulgated by TABC. The applicant shall, upon request by the Village, provide to the Village any information related to its TABC-issued license or permit.
- (d) <u>Availability for inspection. An applicant shall make the place of business available for any investigation or inspection required by this section.</u>
- (e) <u>Scope of inspections. Inspections under this section may relate to requirements established</u> by any other applicable provisions of the Village's Code of Ordinances.

- (f) Review of application. The Village administrator shall review and route the application to staff as necessary to review and comment on the application.
- (g) <u>Standards for certification</u>. The Village administrator shall certify an application if he/she determines that:
 - (1) The sale of alcoholic beverages at the place of business is an authorized use at that location; and
 - (2) The place of business complies with all applicable provisions of the Village's Code of Ordinances.
- (h) <u>Certification without re-inspection</u>. A Village official reviewing an application under <u>subsection</u> (f) may certify an application under this section without re-inspecting a place <u>of business if:</u>
 - (1) The place of business was inspected by the Village in the 12 months preceding the date an application was filed; and
 - (2) The Village determines there has been no material change that affects the certification required by this section since the previous inspection.
- (i) A permit fee is levied in the amount of one-half (½) of the state permit fee for each permit issued for premises located within the Village, except for permits that are exempted from municipal fees. (Ref. Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code §§ 11.38 and 61.36.)
- (j) Due date for payment of fees. An applicant shall pay the fees established in this Ordinance to the Village no later than the 30th day after the date the applicant's payment of a state permit or license fee is due.
- (k) <u>Failure to pay fees.</u> A permittee and licensee who sells an alcoholic beverage at a business location before the applicant pays the fees established by this section commits an offense punishable in accordance with this Ordinance.
- (l) <u>Issuance of receipt</u>. The Village secretary shall issue and deliver a receipt under this section to the permittee or licensee authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages under this section and a state permit or license, if the permittee or licensee:
 - (1) Pays the fees established by this Ordinance; and
 - (2) Exhibits the permit or license issued by the state
- (m) It is an offense for any person licensed under this article to fail to display the Village permit and keep the same displayed in a conspicuous place in the place of business licensed. "

SECTION III. SAVINGS CLAUSE

The repeal of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying, or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue, or as affecting any rights of the Village under any section or provisions of any ordinances at the time of passage of this ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017.07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE VILLAGE LIMITS; REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2009.06, ORDINANCE NO. 2008.09 AND OTHER CONFLICTING ORDINANCES OR RESOLUTIONS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, voters in the Village of Salado have approved the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption, the sale of mixed beverages by food and beverage certificate holders only, the legal sale of wine on the premises of a permitted winery and the sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only;

WHEREAS, on April 3, 2008, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 2008.09 establishing distance regulations for the sale of alcoholic beverages from schools, churches, hospitals and day care centers; prohibiting the sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption in residential areas; adopting hours of sale for alcoholic beverages; and establishing a permit requirement and fees for the sale of alcoholic beverages as permitted by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code; and

WHEREAS, on August 20, 2009, the Board adopted Ordinance No. 2009.06 which amended Ordinance No. 2008.09 to rescind the requirement to obtain a permit from the Village for the sale of alcoholic beverages within the Village limits.

WHEREAS, the Board now finds it reasonable and necessary to repeal and replace the regulations enacted under Ordinance No. 2008.09 and Ordinance No. 2009.06 and provide new;

WHEREAS, the regulations established by this Ordinance are in furtherance of the public interest, for the good government, peace, order, trade, and commerce of the Village and necessary and proper for carrying out the power granted by law to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the following enactments are a valid exercise of the Village's broad police powers and based on the Village's statutory regulatory authority, including, but not limited to, Texas Local Government Code Chapters 51, 52, and 211; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the provisions of this Ordinance will serve to promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, parties in interest and citizens have had an opportunity to be heard regarding this Ordinance at a meeting of the Board, an agenda for which was posted at the Municipal Building more than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the respective hearings;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS:

SECTION I

All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative and factual findings of the Board and are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION II.

The Village of Salado Alcoholic Beverage Ordinance set forth in "Exhibit A" is hereby adopted.

SECTION III.

Ordinance No. 2008.09 and Ordinance No. 2009.06 are hereby repealed and replaced in their entirety, and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of conflict with this Ordinance.

SECTION IV.

The repeal of any ordinance or part of ordinances effectuated by the enactment of this Ordinance shall not be construed as abandoning any action now pending under or by virtue of such ordinance or as discontinuing, abating, modifying or altering any penalty accruing or to accrue, or as affecting any rights of the City under any section or provisions of any ordinances at the time of passage of this Article.

SECTION V.

Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or section of this Ordinance be adjusted or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance in whole or any part or provision thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional.

SECTION VI.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances or parts of ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein; provided, however, that all prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent that such inconsistency is apparent. This Ordinance shall not be construed to require or allow any act that is prohibited by any other ordinance.

SECTION VII.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication as may be required by law.

SECTION VIII.

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code. Notice was also provided as required by Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ORDINANCE

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

Alcohol: Ethyl alcohol, hydrated oxide of ethyl, or spirits of wine, from whatever source or by whatever process produced.

Alcoholic Beverage: Includes all alcohol, distilled spirits, beer, malt beverage, wine, or fortified wine as defined in this Ordinance.

Beer or Malt Beverage: Any alcoholic beverage obtained by the fermentation of any infusion or decoction of barley, malt, hops, or any other product, or any combination of such products in water containing not more than fourteen percent (14%) alcohol by volume, and including ale, porter, brown, stout, lager beer, small beer, and strong beer. Also included are beverages known as "non-alcoholic beer" which is made by fermentation of any infusion or decoction of barley, malt, hops, or other products, and containing less than three percent (3%), but more than zero point one percent (0.1%) alcohol by volume. The term "malt beverage" does not include sake, known as Japanese rice wine.

Child-care facility: A facility licensed, certified, or registered by the Department of Human Services to provide assessment, care, training, education, custody, treatment, or supervision for a child who is not related by blood, marriage, or adoption to the owner or operator of the facility, for all or part of the 24-hour day, whether or not the facility is operated for profit or charges for the services it offers.

Day Care Center: A child-care facility that provides care for more than twelve (12) children under fourteen (14) years of age for less than 24 hours a day.

Fortified Wine: Any alcoholic beverage containing more than twenty-one percent (21%) alcohol by volume made from fruits, berries, or grapes, either by natural fermentation or by natural fermentation with brandy added. "Fortified wine" includes, but is not limited to, brandy.

Permittee: The individual to whom a license is issued or, in the case of a partnership or corporation, all partners, officers, and directors of said partnership or corporation.

Person: Any individual, firm, partnership, cooperative, nonprofit membership corporation, joint venture, association, company, corporation, agency, syndicate, estate, trust, business trust, receiver, fiduciary, or other group or combination acting as a unit, body politic, or political subdivision, whether public, private, or quasi public.

Place of Worship: A building or structure, or groups of buildings or structures, that by design and construction are primarily intended for conducting organized religious services and associated accessory uses.

School, private: A school including a parochial school that is not operated by an Independent School District that offers a course of instruction for students in one or more grades from kindergarten through grade twelve (12) and has more than 100 students enrolled and attending courses at a single location.

School, public: Any school operated by an Independent School District that offers a course of instruction for students in one or more grades from kindergarten through grade twelve (12).

Wine: Any alcoholic beverage containing not more than twenty-one percent (21%) alcohol made from fruits, berries, or grapes either by natural fermentation or by natural fermentation with brandy added. "Wine" includes, but is not limited to, all sparkling wines, champagnes, combinations of such beverages, vermouths, special natural wines, rectified wines, and like products. The term "wine" does not include Fortified Wine or cooking wine mixed with salt or other ingredients so as to render it unfit for human consumption as a beverage.

SECTION 2. PERMITS

2.1. Permit Required

It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture, distill, brew, sell, or possess for the purpose of sale any beer, wine, or other alcoholic beverage, or otherwise engage in any activity for which a license or permit is required by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code as amended, unless the person has a current and unrevoked permit issued by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

SECTION 3. THE SALE, STORAGE OR HANDLING OF ALCOHOL BEVERAGES IN THE VILLAGE CITY LIMITS

3.1. Sale of Beer and Wine Prohibited in Residential Areas

The sale, storage or handling of beer and wine for the purpose of sale is prohibited in residential areas in the Village limits. Under this Section, residential areas shall mean any property located in the following districts as described in the Village of Salado Zoning Ordinance, as amended from time to time:

- A. Agriculture (A)
- B. Single-Family Estate Residential (SF-21)
- C. Single-Family Residential (SF-7)
- D. Single-Family Residential-Patio Home (SF-PH)

- E. Single-Family Attached Residential (SFA)
- F. Multi-Family Residential-1 (MF-1)
- G. Any residential component of an approved planned development

3.2. Sale of Alcoholic Beverages near Schools, Day-Care Centers, Child-Care Facilities, Churches or Hospitals

- A. The sale, storage or handling of alcoholic beverages for the purpose of sale is not permitted in any zoning district where the place of business is located within three hundred (300') of a church, public or private school, or public hospital unless expressly granted an exception pursuant to the requirements of this section.
- B. The sale, storage or handling of alcoholic beverages for the purpose of sale is not permitted in any zoning district where the place of business is located within one thousand (1,000') of a public or private school if the governing body of the public or private school has requested the Village impose the one thousand (1,000') distance restriction, unless expressly granted an exception pursuant to the requirements of this section.
- C. The sale, storage or handling of alcoholic beverages for the purpose of sale is not permitted in any zoning district where the place of business is located within three hundred (300') feet of a day-care center or a child-care facility as defined in the Texas Human Resources Code Section 42.002 and the permit or license holder does not hold a food and beverage certificate issued by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, unless expressly varied pursuant to the requirements of this section, exception that this provision shall not apply:
 - 1. If the permit or license holder and the day-care center or child-care facility are located on different stories of a multi-story building; or
 - If the permit or license holder and the day-care center or child-care facility are located in separate buildings and either the permit or license holder or the daycare center or child-care facility is located on the second story or higher of a multistory building
- D. The distance between the place of business where alcoholic beverages are sold and a church or public hospital shall be measured along the property lines of the street fronts and from front door to front door, and in direct line across intersections.
- E. The distance between the place of business where alcoholic beverages are sold and a school, day-care center or child-care facility shall be measured in a direct line from the property line of the school, day-care center or child-care facility to the property line of the place of business, and in direct line across intersections.
- F. Waiver of Minimum Distances.

- 1. The Board of Aldermen may waive the distance restrictions in subsections (A), (B) and (C), if, after notice and a public hearing, the Board determines that enforcement of the restriction in a particular instance:
 - a. is not in the best interest of the public;
 - b. constitutes waste or the inefficient use of land or other resources;
 - c. creates an undue hardship on the applicant;
 - d. does not serve its intended purpose;
 - e. is not effective or necessary; or
 - f. for any other reason the Board, after consideration of the health, safety and welfare of the public and the equities of the situation, determines it is in the best interest of the community.
- 2. The Board may consider the written consent to a waiver under this subsection from each church, public or private school, public hospital, dare-care center or child-care facility within the required minimum distance from the applicant's proposed place of business filed by the applicant with the Village to be sufficient justification for a waiver.
- 3. To request a waiver under this subsection, the applicant must submit an applicant to the Village with all information requested and required by the Village and pay an administrative fee.
- 4. The Village shall distribute notice of an application and related public hearing for a waiver to the minimum distance requirements by:
 - a. publication once in a newspaper of general circulation in the location in which the waiver is requested; and
 - b. mail not fewer than fifteen (15) days before the date of the Board's required public hearing under this subsection to:
 - i. the applicant;
 - ii. the record owner of real property located within three hundred (300') feet of the proposed place of business according to the most recent tax appraisal roll; and
 - iii. a neighborhood organization on file with the Village that has requested notice of an applicant for the waiver under this subsection; and

3.3 Hours of Sale of Alcoholic Beverages

A. Beer and Wine Permit

The hours of sale and delivery for alcoholic beverages sold under a wine and beer retailer's off-premise permit as established by Section 105.04 of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code, are the same as those prescribed for the sale of beer under Section 105.05 of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage code, except that no sale shall be allowed between 2:00 a.m. and noon on Sunday. The hours of sale and delivery for alcoholic beverages sold under a wine and beer retailer's off-premise permit shall be established by Section 105.05 as follows:

- 1. Monday through Saturday: A wine and beer retailer's off-premise permittee may sell, offer for sale, or deliver wine and beer between the hours of midnight and 2:00 a.m. and between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and midnight on any day except Sunday.
- 2. Sunday: A wine and beer retailer's off-premise permittee may sell, offer for sale, or deliver wine and beer between the hours of midnight and 2:00 a.m. and between the hours of noon and midnight, except that permittees or licenses authorized to sell for on-premise consumption may sell wine and beer between 10:00 a.m. and noon if the wine and beer is served to a customer during the service of food to the customer.

B. Mixed Beverage Permit

The hours of sale for mixed beverages shall be as established by Section 105.03, Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code, as follows:

- 1. Monday through Saturday: A mixed beverage permittee may sell and offer for sale mixed beverages between the hours of midnight and 2:00 a.m. and between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and midnight.
- 2. Sunday: A mixed beverage permittee may sell and offer for sale mixed beverages between midnight and 2:00 a.m. and between 10:00 a.m. and midnight, except that an alcoholic beverage served to a customer between 10:00 a.m. and 12 noon on Sunday must be provided during the service of food to the customer.

SECTION 4. PENALTY

Any person, firm, association of persons, company, corporation, or their agents, servants, or employees violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined, upon conviction, not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), and each day any violation or noncompliance continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense. The penalty provided herein shall be cumulative of other remedies provided by State Law, and the power of injunction as provided in Section 54.012 of the Texas Local Government Code, as may be amended, may be exercised in enforcing this Ordinance whether or not there has been a complaint filed.

Board of Aldermen Governance Policy and Rules of Procedure



Board Governance Policy And Rules of Procedure

SECTION I INTRODUCTION

The Board of Aldermen is the governing body for the Village of Salado, Texas. Therefore, it must bear the initial responsibility for the integrity of governance.

The Board of Aldermen shall determine its own rules and order of business. The Board of Aldermen is responsible for its own discipline and its own performance. The development of this policy is designed to ensure effective and efficient governance.

This policy addresses Mayor and Board relations, Board and Village staff relations, Board and media relations, roles, and meetings. By adopting these guidelines, we, as members of the Board of Aldermen acknowledge our responsibility to each other to our professional staff and to the public.

Board Governance Policy And Rules of Procedure

SECTION II MISSION

In order to ensure proper discharge of duties for the improvement of democratic local government, members of the Board of Aldermen will display behavior that demonstrates independent, impartial review of all matters addressed by them, and be duly responsible to the citizens of Salado and each other in their relationships.

Board GOVERNANCE POLICY AND RULES OF PROCEDURE

SECTION III INFORMATION

On major policy issues, the Village Administrator shall provide briefing material to the Board of Aldermen in advance of the Board of Aldermen's consideration of policy alternatives. Whenever possible, the management report shall be distributed more than a week in advance of consideration by the Board of Aldermen.

Board GOVERNANCE POLICY AND RULES OF PROCEDURE

SECTION IV ROLES

- 4.1 The Mayor shall preside at meetings of the Board of Aldermen and shall be recognized as head of Village government for all ceremonial purposes and by the Governor for purpose of military law but shall have no regular administrative duties. The Mayor may participate in the discussion of all matters coming before the Board of Aldermen. The Board of Aldermen shall elect, from among the Board members, a Mayor Pro-tem who shall act as Mayor during the absence or disability of the Mayor.
- 4.2 As head of the Village government for ceremonial purposes, the Mayor may issue and present proclamations and recognitions and attend other ceremonial functions on behalf of the Village of Salado. Members of the Board of Aldermen may initiate, through the Mayor, or by a majority vote of the Board of Aldermen, similar items of recognition. Major community events sponsored by the Village shall be a policy decision of the Board of Aldermen.
- 4.3 The Mayor shall preserve order and decorum and shall require members of the Board of Aldermen engaged in debate to limit discussion to the question under consideration.
- 4.4 The Mayor will encourage all members of the Board of Aldermen to participate in the Board's discussions and give each member an opportunity to speak before any member can speak again on the same subject.

Board GOVERNANCE POLICY AND RULES OF PROCEDURE

SECTION V MEETINGS

5.1 Regular Meetings

The Board of Aldermen shall meet regularly, at such times, as prescribed by ordinance but no less frequently than once each month and the regular meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m., unless postponed or canceled for valid reasons. If there is a need to change the date, time or place of a regular meeting, an attempt shall be made to contact all members of the Board of Aldermen about the proposed change prior to the change being made.

5.2 Special Meetings

Special meetings may be held on any day of the week to consider items that require action prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting and may be called upon at the request of the Mayor. If there is a need to change the date, time or place of a special meeting, an attempt shall be made to contact all members of the Board of Aldermen about the proposed change prior to the change being made.

5.3 Executive Sessions

The Board of Aldermen may meet in executive session in compliance with the Texas Open Meetings Act. A final action, decision or vote on a matter deliberated in an executive session will be made in an open meeting for which proper notice is provided. All discussions in executive session shall remain confidential.

5.4 Public Notice

The agenda for all regular meetings, special meetings and the notice listing items to be considered shall be posted on the Village's official bulletin board, in accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, and on the Village's website.

5.5 Attendance

Members of the Board of Aldermen are expected to attend all meetings and stay in attendance during each meeting. No member shall leave a meeting without advising the presiding officer.

5.6 Conflict of Interest

Any member of the Board of Aldermen prevented from voting due to a conflict of interest shall leave the meeting during the debate, shall not vote on the matter, and shall otherwise comply with the state law and Village ordinances concerning conflicts of interest. Any member of the Board of Aldermen filing a conflict of interest affidavit on an executive session item shall not confer with Village staff, the City Attorney, Board members or the Mayor regarding the item.

5.7 Board of Aldermen Members

- (a) During Board of Aldermen meetings and work sessions, members of the Board of Aldermen shall assist in preserving order and decorum and shall, neither by conversation or otherwise delay or interrupt the proceedings nor refuse to obey the rules of the Board of Aldermen.
- (b) A member of the Board of Aldermen desiring to speak shall address the presiding officer, and upon recognition by the presiding officer, shall confine discussion to the question under debate, avoid discussion of personalities, and in appropriate language and refrain from personal attacks and verbal abuse.
- (c) A member of the Board of Aldermen, once recognized by the presiding officer, shall not be interrupted while speaking except for the following reasons:
 - Called to order by the presiding officer
 - A point of order is raised by another member
 - The speaker chooses to yield to questions from another member

If a member of the Board of Aldermen is called to order while speaking, that member of the Board of Aldermen shall cease speaking immediately until the question of order is determined. If ruled to be in order, the member shall be permitted to proceed. If ruled to be not in order, the member shall remain silent or make additional remarks so as to comply with the rules of the Board of Aldermen.

- (d) When there is more than one speaker on the same subject, members of the Board of Aldermen shall delay their comments until after all speakers on the subject have been heard.
- (e) The presiding officer shall state all questions submitted for a vote and announce the result. If the vote is not unanimous, the presiding officer shall announce the names of members voting in favor and in opposition to the motion.

5.8 Administrative Staff

- (a) Members of the administrative staff and employees of the Village shall observe the same rules and decorum applicable to members of the Board of Aldermen.
- (b) Although the presiding officer has the authority to preserve decorum in meetings, the Village Administrator is responsible for the orderly conduct and decorum of all City employees under the Village Administrator's direction and control.
- (c) The Village Administrator shall take such disciplinary action, as may be necessary, to ensure that decorum is preserved at all times by Village employees in meetings.
- (d) All persons addressing the Board of Aldermen, including the Village Administrator, shall be recognized by the presiding officer and shall limit remarks to the matter under discussion.
- (e) All remarks and questions addressed to the Board of Aldermen shall be addressed to the Board of Aldermen as a whole and not to any individual member.

5.9 Citizens and Visitors

- (a) Citizens and visitors are welcome to attend all public meetings of the Board of Aldermen and will be admitted to the Board's Chamber or meeting room up to the fire safety capacity of the room.
- (b) Everyone attending the meeting will refrain from private conversations while the Board of Aldermen is in session.
- (c) Citizens and visitors attending Board of Aldermen meetings shall observe the same rules of propriety, decorum, and good conduct applicable to members of the Board of Aldermen. Any person making personal, impertinent, profane, or slanderous remarks or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Board of Aldermen or while attending the meeting shall be removed from the room if so directed by the presiding officer. The person shall be barred from further audience before the Board of Aldermen during that session. If the presiding officer fails to act, any member of the Board of Aldermen may move to require enforcement of the rules, and the affirmative vote of a majority of the Board of Aldermen shall require the presiding officer to act.

- (d) Unauthorized remarks from the audience, stamping of feet, whistles, yells, and similar demonstrations shall not be permitted by the presiding officer who may direct the removal of offenders from the room. In case the presiding officer shall fail to act, any member of the Board of Aldermen may move to require enforcement of the rules, and the affirmative vote of the majority of the Board of Aldermen shall require the presiding officer to act.
- (e) No placards, banners or signs will be permitted in the Board's Chamber or in any other room in which the Board of Aldermen is meeting. Exhibits, displays and visual aids used in connection with presentations, however, are permitted.
- (f) The Village Administrator or his designee shall act as sergeant at arms for the Board of Aldermen and shall furnish whatever assistance is needed to enforce the rules of the Board of Aldermen.

5.10 Agenda

- (a) The Mayor and any member of the Board of Aldermen may request an item be placed on a future agenda. The Village Administrator must place an item on the agenda if the item is requested by the Mayor or any member of the Board of Aldermen. With the exception of proclamations, any item requested to be placed on a future agenda by the Mayor and any member of the Board of Aldermen must be discussed by the Board of Aldermen in a Workshop Session prior to being placed on a Board of Aldermen Regular Meeting Agenda for discussion and possible action.
- (b) Any proposed ordinance which establishes new regulations with and any proposed ordinance amending an existing ordinance which established regulations shall be discussed by the Board of Aldermen in a Workshop Session prior to the proposed ordinance being placed on a Board of Aldermen Regular Meeting Agenda for discussion and possible action. The Village Administrator, after consulting with the Mayor, may place a proposed ordinance on a Board of Aldermen Regular Meeting Agenda without first placing the ordinance on a Workshop Session Agenda should circumstances justify the need to do so.

5.11 Speakers

- (a) A person wishing to address the Board of Aldermen must first sign the Speaker Registration Form. The following information must be provided on the form:
 - Name
 - Residence Address
 - The subject matter to be addressed
- (b) Speakers must address their comments to the presiding officer rather than to individual members of the Board of Aldermen or Village staff.
- (c) Speakers must keep their remarks specific to the item being considered by the Board of Aldermen. If the speaker is addressing the Board of Aldermen under Citizens Communications, the speaker may address any item not slated for discussion on the agenda. Comments from speakers should not be directed towards any specific member of the Board of Aldermen or Village staff. Comments should not be accusatory, derogatory, or threatening in nature. These guidelines for speaker decorum shall be posted on each Board of Aldermen agenda and on Speaker Sign-In Sheets for all Board of Aldermen meetings.
- (d) A person who registers to speak on an item listed on the agenda will be called on after the presiding officer gains agreement to do so by the Board of Aldermen. A person who registers to speak under Citizens Communications will be called on at that time. The presiding officer may determine the order in which speakers are called.
- (e) All speakers will have a maximum of three (3) minutes to address the Board of Aldermen. A majority vote of the Board of Aldermen will be required to extend the time limit. The presiding officer may impose more restrictive time limits if a large number of persons register to speak. Guidelines relating to time allotment for speakers shall be posted on each Board of Aldermen agenda and on Speaker Sign-In Sheets for all Board of Aldermen meetings.
- (f) For called public hearings, the applicant will be allowed a maximum of ten (10) minutes to make a presentation.
- (g) In accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, the Board of Aldermen will not discuss or consider any item addressed during Citizens Communications. Members of the Board of Aldermen will not interact with the public during the time allotted to speakers unless a non-debatable motion approved by the Board of Aldermen allots a specific amount of time.

(h) Whenever it is necessary for a speaker to use an interpreter to translate comments to the Board of Aldermen, the time required for the translation will not be counted against the designated time allotted for the speaker to address the Board of Aldermen.

5.12 Motions

- (a) No motion may be moved or suggested until all discussion by members of the Board of Aldermen is complete and the presiding officer calls for the motion. A motion made and seconded will be considered the main motion. Any member of the Board of Aldermen member may move to amend a motion. The amendment must receive a second before it may be discussed and must be voted on prior to voting on the main motion.
- (b) A motion may be withdrawn or modified by its mover without asking permission until the motion is voted upon. If the mover modifies the motion, the member of the Board of Aldermen who seconded the motion may withdraw the second.
- (c) At any time after a motion has been made and seconded, a member of the Board of Aldermen member may call the question which will have the affect of stopping the debate and requiring the Board of Aldermen to immediately proceed to vote on the motion to call the question.
- (d) A motion to reconsider any action of the Board of Aldermen must be made no later than prior to the conclusion of the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Aldermen. Such a motion may only be made by a member of the Board of Aldermen who voted with the prevailing side. The motion to reconsider may be seconded by any member. No question shall be twice reconsidered except by unanimous vote of the Board of Aldermen except that action relating to any contract may be reconsidered at any time before the final execution thereof.
 - (i) If a motion to reconsider is made at the same meeting at which the matter was acted upon, the motion may be heard and voted upon and the original action on the matter is set aside. Deliberation may then resume on the matter at that same meeting.
 - (ii) If a motion to reconsider is made at the next meeting after the matter was acted upon, the motion to reconsider may be heard and voted upon and the original action on the matter is not set aside. Deliberation may not resume on the matter but it shall be placed on the next available agenda for deliberation.

5.13 Suspension of Rules

Any provision of these rules not governed by Village ordinance, State or Federal law may be temporarily suspended by a majority vote of the members of the Board of Aldermen present. The vote on any such suspension shall be taken by yeas and nays and entered upon the record.

5.14 Amendment of Rules

These rules may be amended or new rules adopted by a majority vote of the members of the Board of Aldermen.

5.15 Failure to Comply

A failure to comply with these rules does not invalidate any otherwise lawful act of the Board of Aldermen.

Board Governance Policy And Rules of Procedure

Section VI Public Contact Media Relations

Representative government is only successful when the citizens are kept informed and educated about the issues facing their municipality. Consequently, it is imperative that the media play an important role in the Board-Administrator-Media relations. It is through an informed public that progress is ensured and good government remains sensitive to its constituents.

These guidelines are designed to help ensure positive relationships with print, radio, and television reporters. The Mayor, Board of Aldermen and the Village Administrator recognize that the news media provide an important link between the Board of Aldermen and the public. It is the Board of Aldermen's desire to establish a professional working relationship to help maintain a well-informed and educated citizenry.

- 6.1 During the conduct of official business, the Village shall designate adequate space for the news media.
- 6.2 All reporters will receive an agenda in advance and will be furnished support material needed for clarification, if requested.

SECTION VII PLANNING

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen are responsible for establishing a vision for the Village of Salado and planning for its future.

- 7.1 On an annual basis, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen shall hold a minimum of one (1) strategic planning session wherein they set priorities goals and objectives The goals and objectives shall address short term and long-term needs of the Village.
- 7.2 Policy direction shall be consistent with the strategic goals and objectives. Sufficient time and consideration should be given to policy alternatives to ensure that decisions are made consistent with the long-term vision.

Section VIII BOARD STAFF RELATIONS

- 8.1 The role of the Village Administrator and the relationship of staff with the Board of Aldermen is addressed in Village ordinance.
- 8.2 The Board of Aldermen shall direct comments, correspondence, and concerns about Village services to the Village Administrator. Citizens concerns, comments and correspondence regarding Village services received by members of the Board of Aldermen shall be forwarded to the Village Administrator for appropriate staff action and a timely response.
- 8.3 Documents provided to one (1) member of the Board of Aldermen shall also be distributed to all other members of the elected body. The Village Administrator shall prepare and submit to the Board of Aldermen, at of the end of the fiscal year, a complete report on the finances and administrative activities of the Village for the preceding year. The Village Administrator shall keep the Board of Aldermen advised of the financial condition and future needs of the Village and make such recommendations that may seem desirable.
- 8.4 In order to ensure proper presentation of agenda items by Village staff, questions arising from members of the Board of Aldermen, after receiving their information packet, should be, whenever possible, presented to the Village Administrator or the Administrator's designated assistant for Village staff consideration prior to the Board of Aldermen meeting. This allows time for Village staff to address such concerns and provide all members of the Board of Aldermen with the additional information.
