

Ordinance 2002.22

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS ESTABLISHING CERTAIN PARKING RESTRICTIONS ALONG CHURCH STREET IN THE VILLAGE OF SALADO; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE ; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE;

WHEREAS, The Village of Salado is charged with regulating parking on its municipal streets in order to maintain the orderly flow of traffic, and to prevent parking congestion that would create a safety hazard to the public; and

WHEREAS, a hazard has developed along certain portions of Church Street south of its intersection with Thomas Arnold Street due to excessive parking on both sides of the street which could interfere with fire and emergency vehicles thereby endangering public safety; and

WHEREAS, in order to alleviate such hazard it is deemed in the best interest of the public to restrict parking on both sides of a portion of Church Street south of its intersection with Thomas Arnold Street:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO, TEXAS, THAT:

Part 1: Beginning at a point 280 feet south of the intersection of Church Street at its intersection with Thomas Arnold Street in the Village of Salado, Texas parking is hereby prohibited at all times along both sides of Church Street until it turns and heads east toward Main Street, and the appropriate designated parties in the village are hereby authorized to place "no parking" signs along both sides of said street, and otherwise appropriately mark same.

Part 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Part 3: It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Board of Aldermen that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance should be declared invalid by the final judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Aldermen without the


