

Ordinance No. 2000.01 Village of Salado County of Bell State of Texas November 21,2000

ORDINANCE CALLING LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX ELECTION

Whereas, in accordance with Section 321.401 of the Tax Code (Tax Code Sec.321.401 Vernons Ann. Civ. Stat.) the Village of Salado wishes to order an election to submit a proposition on the levy and collection of a local sales and use tax in the Village; and

Whereas, adoption of the sales and use tax will not result in the combined rate of all sales and use taxes imposed by the Village and other political subdivisions having territory in the Village exceeding 2%, and

Whereas, the Village of Salado Board of Aldermen wishes to proceed with the ordering of an election for January 20, 2001, the next uniform election date, and appointing election officials required for the conduct of the election, and has deemed it advisable to call the election hereinafter ordered; and

Whereas, the meeting to adopt this Ordinance was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by Chapter 551 of the Government Code, as amended:

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO:

1. That an election shall be held by the Village of Salado between the hours of 7:00am and 7:00 pm on January 20, 2001, in the Village at the following designated Polling Place:

Polling Place No. 1: Salado Civic Center, 511 North Main, Salado, Texas 76571 which lies within the boundaries of the Village, and the following election officers are hereby appointed to hold the election at this location:

Presiding Judge:

James Pringle

Alternate Presiding Judge:

Attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and hereby incorporated by reference, is a description of the boundaries of the Village of Salado.

2. That the Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two or more than ten qualified election clerks to serve and assist in conducting said election as further directed by the Village, provided that if the Presiding Judge actually serves as expected, the Alternate

Presiding Judge shall be one of the clerks.

- 3. Voting in the election shall be by the use of paper ballots which shall be printed in both English and Spanish and which shall conform to the requirements of the Texas Election Code. Oral bilingual assistance shall be available during the election and may be obtained by contacting the Presiding Election Judge or the Alternate Election Judge.
- 4. That early voting by personal appearance will be conducted between the hours of 8:00am and 5:00pm beginning on January 3, 2001, and ending on January 16, 2001, on each day which is not a Saturday, a Sunday or an official state holiday. Early voting by personal appearance will be conducted at the following location:

Salado Civic Center 511 North Main Salado, Texas, 76571

The early voting clerk shall keep the early voting place open during such hours for early voting by personal appearance. The early voting clerk for the election shall be James Pringle and the deputy early voting clerk for said election shall be Jean Westerberg.

An application for early voting ballot by mail shall be mailed to:

Applications for early voting ballots by mail must be received by close of business on January 12, 2001.

- 5. That an Early Voting Ballot Board is hereby created to process early voting results, and Jean Westerberg shall serve as presiding judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board. The presiding judge shall appoint at least two other members of said board.
- 6. The election shall be held and conducted and returns made to the Salado Village Board of Aldermen in accordance with the Texas Election Code.
- 7. That all qualified resident electors of the Village of Salado shall be entitled to vote at said election.
- 8. The Secretary of the Village of Salado is hereby directed to cause notice of this election to be published once in both English and Spanish in a newspaper of general circulation published in Bell County, Texas and in the Village of Salado not more than 30 days before the date set for election. In addition., a substantial copy of this Ordinance shall be posted in three public places within the Village of Salado and the Salado Civic Center not

later than 21 days before the election. The notice shall be substantially in the form of Notice of Election attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and made a part hereof for all purposes.

9. At the election, the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with the law:

PROPOSITION: the adoption of a local sales and use tax in the Village of Salado at the rate of one(1.00%)per cent.

Each voter may vote for or against such proposition by placing an "x" in the square beside the word "FOR" or in the square beside the word "AGAINST".

10. That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings, and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITION to be expressed substantially as follows:

- 11. That the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Salado shall issue the local sales and use tax authorized under the Proposition is such proposition passes.
- 12 That in all respects, said election shall be conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code .

RESOLUTION FORWARDING RESULTS OF SALES AND USE TAX ELECTION TO STATE OF TEXAS COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE

Whereas, on January 20, 2001, at a duly called election for the imposition of a one per-cent sales and use tax in the Village of Salado, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2000.01 voters in the incorporated Village of Salado approved, by a majority of the votes cast, the PROPOSITION FOR THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX IN THE VILLAGE OF SALADO AT THE RATE OF ONE PER-CENT; AND

Whereas, on January 20, 2001 the votes were officially certified by the Presiding Election Judge, the Alternate Presiding Election Judge, the Mayor Pro-Tem and the Mayor, a copy of such certification being attached hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE VILLAGE OF SALADO THAT:

The results of the election to impose a one per-cent sales and use tax in the Village of Salado showing that a majority of the voters casting votes voted in favor of the proposition FOR THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX IN THE VILLAGE OF SALADO AT THE RATE OF ONE PER-CENT be forwarded to the State of Texas Comptroller's Office so that it might issue the appropriate letters to businesses operating within the Incorporated boundaries of the Village of Salado to collect the one per-cent sales and use tax for the Village of Salado.
